



RePORT ON THE CAMEROON SCHOOL DEBATE CHAMPIONSHIP (CSDC) – YAOUNDE 2025

Date: 10/02/2025

Venue: Pinnacle of Success Academy, Yaoundé-Cameroon

The Cameroon School Debate Championship (CSDC is a prestigious annual event that has been fostering intellectual engagement among students since its inception in 2024. Organized collaboratively by the Baseline Orators Network and the Commonwealth Students' Union, this competition serves as a platform for students from various schools to engage in stimulating activities such as debates, public speaking, and environmental quizzes.

The primary objective of the CSDC is to empower students by enhancing their communication skills, sharpening their critical thinking and reasoning abilities, and building their self-confidence. Additionally, the event aims to promote teamwork and encourage participants to develop a keen awareness of pressing social, political, environmental, and ethical issues.

This year marked the 2nd edition of the championship, hosted by **Pinnacle of Success Academy in Ekoudoum, Yaoundé.** The event saw the participation of three distinguished schools:

- PINNACLE OF SUCCESS ACADEMY
- FRANKY COMPREHENSIVE SECONDARY SCHOOL
- SAINT JOSEPH CALASANZ

Overview of the Event

The debate competition was meticulously structured to ensure an engaging and competitive atmosphere. Each participating school fielded two teams—Team A and Team B—comprised of three dedicated members. To maintain fairness and provide valuable feedback, each school also contributed two student adjudicators who assessed the performances throughout the event.

Rounds of Debate

The competition unfolded across several intense rounds:

- 1. **Round 1:** In this initial round, students received their motion a day prior to the event, allowing them ample time to prepare their arguments. The motion for this debate was, "This house would expel students who engage in violent behaviors in school." Teams presented thought-provoking arguments, showcasing their research and passion.
- 2. **Round 2:** The second round introduced an element of surprise, as students were given their motion just 30 minutes before the debate commenced. The motion for this debate

was, "This house believes that the voting age should be lowered to 16." Armed with only dictionaries, they had to think on their feet. This round tested not only their knowledge but also their adaptability and quick thinking.
